



With more than 250 000 active members, AfriForum is the largest civil rights organisation in Africa. AfriForum was founded in 2006 and forms part of the Solidarity Movement.

As a civil society advocacy group, AfriForum aims to protect and promote the rights and freedoms of Afrikaners and other minority communities at the southern tip of Africa. The organisation drives a variety of campaigns, including campaigns for the protection of property rights and the free market, and campaigns against farm murders and corruption. AfriForum particularly emphasises community involvement, which is why the organisation has already established

more than 150 branches across South Africa and more than 157 community safety networks. Through these structures more than 10 000 volunteers are already contributing to keeping their communities safe.

AfriForum's Private Prosecution Unit works to ensure that justice prevails when the criminal justice system fails people. The organisation's Trauma Support Unit supports crime victims. The AfriForum Network encourages business and cooperation between AfriForum's members, while the Friends of AfriForum platform provides a means through which people abroad can also contribute to AfriForum's work.
